November 2024

Believe it or not there are just 50 days to go until Christmas Day so it made a nice change from Christmas shopping to be sampling wine at the November meeting.

Luckily the weather held and 16 individuals, including Karen our new member, congregated at 'The Kitchen' to sample six wines, whose theme was not revealed on the day (Nick forgot); in addition we held a small quiz to test the accumulated knowledge learnt over the past 30 months and having tasted 183 different wines! Details of the quiz are at the end of this document.

We started with three whites:

- 1. Nyetimber 'Classic Cuvée' Brut, Chardonnay, West Sussex, 12%. RRP £45 we paid £29
- 2. Cune Barrel Fermented Rioja Blanco 2022, Spain, 13%, RRP £12.99 we paid £9.99
- 3. Jaboulet Aîné Viognier 2022/23, France, 13.5%, RRP £12.99 we paid £9.99

The first wine was the official sparkling wine of Team GB at the Paris 2024 Olympics. Needless to say it was well received. A vote was taken on the remaining two whites with the clear winner being the Viognier which received 14 votes.



Onto the reds:

- 4. 'Yerevan 782 BC' Red 2023 Armenia, 13%, RRP £12.99 we paid £11.69
- 5. Cave de Lugny Bourgogne Pinot Noir 2022, France, 12.5%, RRP 16.99 we paid £14.99
- 6. Fonseca Bin 27 Port, Portugal, 20%, RRP £18.99 we paid £16.99

The Port was a surprise but was very well received garnering 10 votes to the Pinot Noir's 6.

After the whites we had the first 7 questions of the quiz with the remaining 7 questions being given after the reds – it was just for fun and the members did manage to answer the majority (I think!).

The Theme was that each of the wines came from an answer in the quiz!
