

### **Yalumba Organic Viognier South Australia, 13%**

Organic. Wine of South Australia. Vegan friendly. Being harmonious with the natural environment has been at the core of our certified organic winemaking program, where our focus is on making delicious wine to be enjoyed with family and friends. Our growers' passion and hard work have produced Viognier grapes rich with flavour. Honeysuckle, fennel and apricot nectar flavours lead into a silky and succulent palate. Enjoy young.

### **Paul Mas Viognier Sauvignon Blanc, France 12.5%**

Rich and fresh. The Paul Mas vineyards are located in the Occitanie region of South of France, and are planted on the hillsides of the 5 best wine-producing valleys of the region. Jean-Claude Mas's expertise and passion for his region results in this Viognier - Sauvignon Blanc blend, a marriage between two very distinct families of savours and structures that create a complex wine with character. The mouth is rich and fresh, it reveals a quintessence of peach, apricot and gooseberry aromas, with a surprising length. It will pair wonderfully with fish, white meat, tapas, goat cheese, or you can just enjoy it on its own! Serve at 12°C. Ageing potential of 5 years.

### **Azevedo Vinho Verde, Portugal 12%**

This is a crisp, light and fresh wine made from Loureiro and Pedernã grapes in the Vinho Verde region of northern Portugal. This is deliciously fresh and fruity with attractive citrus notes and a crisp apple skin character. Perfect to drink on its own it would also match well with fresh seafood.

### **Naudin Père et Fils Pinot Noir 2022/23, France, 13%**

Doudet-Naudin was founded in 1849 and is one of the oldest maisons in Burgundy. Just like their most-expensive bottles, this is made by their fantastic winemaker and owner, Christophe Rochet. But this time it's from grapes grown all across France. It's your chance to taste his expertise at a lower price. Expect a light, velvety Pinot Noir with flavours of red and black fruits. It has a snappy acidity that's great with roast chicken.

Grapes are grown in a cool climate giving them a herbal or tomato smell. They tend to be lower in sugar, alcohol and calories.

### **Boumvine 'The Red' 2023, Swartland, 13.5%**

Back in 1995 the Gabb family, originally from Shropshire in the UK, fell in love with a picturesque wine farm in South Africa. And it turned out that the terroir – nestled among the Schapenberg Hills on 350-million-year-old decomposed granite – was just as good as the fantastic views. Cooling southeasterly winds from nearby False Bay and the Atlantic Ocean, coupled with plenty of sunshine, ripen grapes to perfection. This blend of Shiraz, Mourvèdre and Grenache has seen some oak ageing, resulting in vanilla, sweet spice and pepper notes. Juicy and full of vibrant, fruity flavours, it's a versatile match for everything from burgers to stews.

### **Solomonar Reserve Red 2022/23, Romania, 13.5%**

It's a blend of Cabernet, Merlot and the indigenous Feteasca Neagra grape made by one of the country's very best wineries. It's full-bodied and rich with notes of blackcurrant, plum, blueberry and vanilla. In 2022, this wine won an IWC award for the 2020 vintage.
