Chafor Estate Bacchus

This is a crisp, elegant and refined single varietal, with a balance of elderflower and inviting minerality. Exemplary winemaking and pristine, concentrated tropical fruit flavours make this an absolute joy

Bacchus is a unique white grape that stays well under the radar despite being predominantly grown on our doorstep here in the UK. Originating from Germany, it is believed to be a combination of Riesling-Silvaner and Müller-Thurgau first produced in the 1930's, however it only became commercially available in the 1970s.

Alcohol: 11.5% Buckinghamshire

Patricius Tokaji Furmint 2023

This wine boasts a distinctive fruity varietal character, complemented with a perfumed nose due to Furmint grape. The palate combines nice minerality and elegant, vibrant acidity to deliver the same fruitiness as the nose with peach and a touch of almond and make a well-balanced and easy-to-drink terroir white wine.

This is an absolutely superb and **fabulous-value** dry wine. **Chablis-like** in structure, texture and **vibrant** acidity (no surprise, since Tokaji is on the same latitude as Chablis). It has far more expressive aromas and flavours of **lemon zest**, peach and honey. Patricius originally made this to satisfy demand for dry white wine within Hungary, however its quality is so exceptional that it has since become their **number one export.**"

Alcohol: 12.5% Hungary

(Terroir is a French term that describes the environmental factors that affect the growth of a crop, and the character of those factors. It can also refer to the unique identity of a wine, which is influenced by the combination of soil, climate, and vine in a specific region)

Samos Vin Doux

It belongs to the Vins de Liqueurs category and it is the most popular wine of Samos. It is the No. 1 sweet wine in sales in Greece and it is exported worldwide. From semi-mountainous and mountainous terraces. It has a light golden color and the nose is dominated by aromas of apricot jam and mature melon. Ripe stone-fruit flavours are balanced with sweetness and a fresh acidity. Perfect with creamy desserts.

Alcohol: 15% Greece

Barkan Kosher Cabernet Sauvignon

This wine is full-bodied yet maintains a superb freshness of fruit. Classic Cabernet Sauvignon character of blackcurrants and dark cherries are given further complexity by some oak-ageing, adding notes of cocoa and spice.

Alcohol: 11.5% Israel

Sorcova Pinot Noir

It's a light wine, with slightly grainy tannins, but its dry, balanced, ripe and carries the appealing hallmarks of Pinot Noir – which are a combination of juicy red berry fruit and a lightweight mouthfeel.

it's unusual to find such fine characters, including some of the vanillin flavours from oak influence, in such an inexpensive Pinot Noir.

Alcohol: 12.5% Romania

Château Oumsiyat Mijana

Intense and aromatic aromas of wild red and black fruits are overlaid with hints of black pepper spice. Well integrated tannins envelope the rich fruit through to a long velvety finish.

Alcohol: 13% Lebanon
